

Peter's

blessing – Matt 16:15-18 – Jesus speaking. But what about you? Who do you say I am? "Peter answered, you are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus replied, "Blessed are you Simon, son of Jonah for this was not revealed to you by man but by my Father in heaven. And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church and the gates of Hades will not overcome it."

From then on Jesus began to explain what was about to happen to him. Matt. 16: 22-23 – Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. "Never Lord this will never happen to you." Jesus turned and said to Peter, "Out of my sight Satan! You are a stumbling block to me; you do not have in mind the things of God but the things of men." From blessing to curse – what happened?? Peter was clueless. He

loved Jesus and wanted to protect him, but Satan targeted Peter's loyalty to Jesus as a tool to rebel against the will of God. Gen. 3:15 – "And I will put enmity between you and the woman and between your offspring and hers; he will crush your head and you will strike his heel"

I'm sure Peter was devastated and wondered if he was kicked off the team. Not so! A few days later, Peter, James and John were invited by Jesus to a mountain get away. Before they could unpack their lunch, within an instant they found themselves at a "Divine Service", a glimpse of heaven, seeing Jesus, the Son of God, in all his Glory speaking with Elijah and Moses, alive and well. Peter's soul is transformed from sadness to gladness, and he wants to sanctify the moment.

Matt. 17:4 – Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good to be here. If

you wish, I will put up three shelters, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah. (Shelters - Job 24:8 – They are drenched by mountain rain and hug the rocks for shelter. Ps 61:3-4 – For you have been my refuge and strong tower against the foe. I long to dwell in your tent forever and take refuge in the shelter of your wings.) Matt. 17:5 – While he was still speaking, a bright cloud enveloped them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased. Listen to him!"

What happens when you hear a sermon personally delivered to you by God the Father Almighty? Matt 17:6-8 – When the disciples heard this they fell face down to the ground, terrified. But Jesus said to them. "Get up, don't' be afraid." When they looked up the saw no one except Jesus. We call this event The Transfiguration. For those who listen and trust in Jesus, they will be transformed from sinners to saints (redeemed sinners) Rom: 10:17 –

Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message. The message is heard through the Word of Christ.

Eph. 2:19 – Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and aliens, but fellow citizens with God's people and members of God's household, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ himself as the chief cornerstone.

The Will of God is Always Best – LSB 758:1-4. The will of God is always best and shall be done forever; And they who trust in him are blest. He will forsake them never, he helps indeed in time of need! He chastens with forbearing. They who depend on God their friend shall not be left despairing.

God is my comfort and my trust, my hope and life abiding; And to his counsel, wise and just, I yield in him confiding. The very hairs, his Word declares, upon my head he numbers. By night and day God is my stay; He never sleeps or slumbers.

Lord, this I ask, O hear my please, deny me not this favor; When Satan sorely troubles me, then do not let me waiver; O guard me well, my fear dispel, fulfill your faithful saying; All who believe by grace receive an answer to their praying.

When life's brief course on earth is run and I this world am leaving, grant me to say, "Your will be done", your faithful Word believing. My dearest friend, I now commend my soul into your keeping. From sin and hell, and death as well by you're the victory reaping.



During this time we will learn about the effects of hunger, complete service projects and have fun with team building activities. This year we will start our famine at 12:00 noon on Friday, November 15th. We will have our "breakfast" meal with Holy Communion on November 16th at the 6:00 pm.
